It started when I came across an advertisement to go on a programme which is the NEET programme, my first step was emailing Brittany that I was interested in this position, which led me to fill an application form out and I was successful. My next few steps were to then go on an induction and learn all about the hospital and what to expect. Britt then placed me on a 10 week work experience on Leyland ward at Chorley, where I learned a lot of knowledge and gained so much experience! The ward itself was amazing and the staff are great. I was put with a Health Care Assistant buddy and I shadowed what they were doing on a day to day basis. This made me gain all the experience that I needed. Every Friday whilst completing the programme we filled out a review form which was then sent to Britt to show what I learnt and how I was progressing. Alongside with the work experience, I had to complete my functional skills for maths; I worked very hard towards my maths exam which payed off because I passed with 91% this enabled me to apply for an HCA position.

After all the experience and passing my maths I was then able to apply for an HCA job, I found a job which I then applied for. Later that week I was offered an interview, which then I had the interview and was successful and I was offered the position as an HCA on Leyland ward where I had my 10 weeks work experience. I was over the moon at the fact I managed to get a job where I had my work experience and I knew everyone and how nice it was on there! Having got the position I was hoping for, I went on a training course for 3 weeks which helped me to know more and have all the training that I needed to work on the ward. Within these 3 weeks we had to complete 15 work booklets and 10 competencies, which I completed and managed to achieve the care certificate.

I am now a full time member of staff at Chorley hospital as a band 2 HCA, this has now given me the opportunity to achieve more and to work my way up and up.
