

# Volunteer Briefing: Essential Skills Summits

## Who are the Skills Builder Partnership?

We are a not-for-profit social enterprise, working to ensure that everyone can build the essential skills to succeed. To do this, we have built a partnership of over 750 schools, colleges, employers and organisations focused on developing skills.

Across the UK, we work to support school leaders and teachers across over 400 schools and colleges to embed essential skills education in their curriculum, ensuring that essential skills development is a core part of learning for every student.

#### What are the essential skills?



### **Volunteering Opportunity**

Our virtual Essential Skills Summits are designed to inspire and motivate students who are following the Skills Builder Programme in their schools and help them understand how essential skills are applied workplace. Each summit will be supported by up to 4 volunteers.

You will be to supporting our mission by taking part in an hour-long discussion and Q&A session with a group of students from one of our partner schools. You will explain what your role involves in simple language and answer students' questions about how you use the eight essential skills above. The session will be led by Skills Builder staff (who are qualified teachers) and supervised by teaching staff from the school.

The first 15 minutes of the event will be a short briefing with a member of the Skills Builder staff before you meet the students and teachers. This will give you the opportunity to cover any questions or queries you have before the session starts.

# **Objectives:**

- Students to understand your role and what your company does.
- Students to apply listening and speaking skills to learn how you use the essential skills.
- Students to reflect on their learnings about the world of work and the skills needed to succeed.

# **IT Requirements**

You will need to have a webcam and be able to access Zoom.



#### **Preparation:**

Students will be from a primary or secondary school and will have been developing their eight essential skills through activities in their school over this academic year. Students will have prepared questions in advance. To help students get the most out of the session:

- Please visit www.skillsbuilder.org/framework to familiarise yourself with the eight essential skills.
- Please reflect on which essential skills are most important to your role. Be ready to share short examples. Eg: *Problem Solving is very important for in my role. For example, one problem I may need to solve is...*
- We would love to invite one of the volunteers to give a short (5 minutes or less) introduction to what your company does using child-friendly language.

#### Schedule:

Once we have received your email address, we will set up a calendar invitation for the specific time and date. The calendar invitation will include the Zoom call details.
